David Kelley - Founder of the D. School & Professor of Eng.

If you've ever used a mouse, a Polaroid i-Zone instant camera, or a Palm V, you've had your first introduction to David. He graduated with a Masters from the JPD and started an upstart product design firm called IDEO that developed those products and a lot more. Since their start, IDEO has grown to be the largest product design firm in the world, but they keep the underdog enthusiasm that put them on top.

Along with heading IDEO, David has also been a professor in Stanford's Joint Program in Design for over 20 years. He has recently taken design thinking even a step further and started the Hasso Plattner Institute for Design - or the D. School. This interdisciplinary group of professors, industry professionals, and students aims to bring design thinking to every discipline, and change the world while they're at it.

While David is a member of the National Academy of Engineering, he is also one of the friendliest, most down-to-earth faculty members and a great story teller.

Bill Burnet - Executive Director of the JPD & Consulting Assistant Professor

Bill holds eight patents, has won an ID Magazine award for the first "slate" computer, and has worked on a wide variety of projects ranging from award-winning Apple PowerBooks to the original Hasbro Star Wars action figures. 
